

Food1st Announces Eight New Restaurant Partners, Expanding Food Assistance Program and Re-Activating More Kitchens

NEW YORK--(BUSINESS WIRE)--May 11, 2020-- Food1st, the non-profit foundation launched last month to address the ongoing food crisis in New York City, today announced that it has expanded its network of restaurant partners to increase the capacity to deliver meals to frontline workers fighting the COVID-19 pandemic and other food insecure New Yorkers.

Food1st launched on April 23, 2020 with its inaugural partner, renowned Chef Daniel Boulud, and Chef Boulud has already delivered approximately 20,000 meals throughout New York City since launching. By re-activating more kitchens in New York City, the program simultaneously helps safely bring food and beverage staff back to work to revitalize the restaurant industry.

"Food1st was just an idea a few weeks ago and it's inspiring to see so many partners and donors step up to feed thousands of first responders and vulnerable New Yorkers every day," said **Marc Holliday, Chairman and CEO of SL Green Realty Corp.** "We're off to a great start but we know we can do more, and hope more people will join us in supporting Food1st."

"I am excited to welcome so many new kitchens to the Food1st program, bringing people safely back to work and bringing excellent food to New Yorkers who need it," said **Chef Daniel Boulud**. "Together we are supporting the need of the COVID-19 crisis and showing the resilience of our industry."

Food1st has added eight new partners, including: Armani Ristorante 5th Avenue, Juice Press, Just Salad, Little Beet, Maman, New York Vintners, Stout, and Sushi Ito. The new set of partners will add capacity and allow Food1st to provide approximately 4,000 meals per day, including breakfast, lunch, dinner and coffee.

"I am happy to partner with SL Green and Chef Boulud on this important initiative. Thanks to Food1st we are able to contribute to New York in a time of need," said **Giorgio Armani**. "As this crisis continues to exacerbate the ongoing food crisis and threatens to put so many restaurants out of business, it's incredible to see so many people working together to make a positive impact."

To date, Food1st has delivered fully-packaged, healthy meals to non-profit distribution partners and medical facilities including: Mount Sinai Hospital, NYU Langone Health, Citymeals on Wheels, Services for the Underserved, The Bowery Mission, World Central Kitchen, New York Presbyterian Hospital, Montefiore Health System, and Columbia University Medical Center.

"The health and safety of our frontline workers and staff during the COVID-19 pandemic has been of great importance to us. This includes providing convenient access to nutritious meals at the beginning or end of a long shift," says **Grace Y. Ko, Executive Vice president for Development and Alumni Affairs at NYU Langone Health.** "We are grateful to Food1st Foundation, SL Green and Chef Boulud for leading this effort."
